**Now in its 22nd year, the Masami Oishi Memorial Scholarship Fund will
recognizes ten of Hawaii's brightest member-students**

HONOLULU—Aloha Pacific Federal Credit Union (Aloha Pacific) has begun accepting applications for the Masami Oishi Memorial Scholarship Fund. The scholarship fund is in honor of Masami "Masa" Oishi, who joined the credit union in 1965 as its first manager. After more than 27 years of service, Masa retired as the President/CEO of the credit union in 1992. In memoriam of his passing, the scholarship fund was renamed in his honor. A special ceremony with the recipients takes place in July.

Aloha Pacific awards ten (10) \$1,500 scholarships to students based on financial need, academic achievement and community service. To apply for the scholarship, applicants must be members in good standing at the credit union for at least one year, enrolled in a baccalaureate or graduate degree program at an accredited college or university and attending the school on a full-time basis during the award year. Completed applications must be submitted and postmarked by April 30.
